The World Languages Department at Delta offers an Associate in Arts in World Languages and Global Studies: a multidisciplinary course of study that encourages global awareness, as well as intercultural communication and understanding through the acquisition of at least one modern language other than English, namely Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Sign Language, and Spanish. The program is designed with the dual intent of developing both linguistic and cultural competence.

Affording multiple opportunities for cross-linguistic and crosscultural comparisons, the program emphasizes and analyzes languages, communication, and global affairs. As the world addresses urgent issues of multiculturalism, race, diversity, and social justice, the broad global perspective offered by this program is of great value. The elective courses allow students to frame their world language acquisition within global studies, culture coursework, and society studies with a regional and international emphasis.

DEGREE OPTION

World Languages and Global studies AA (Associate in Arts)

Students obtain an Associate of Arts Degree in World Languages and Global Studies by completing 16 units of sequential courses in one language or a minimum of 18 units in two levels of two different languages.

Additionally, students complete 3 units in a course of their choice from the Global Studies elective courses list.
