
5-Paragraph Essay Structure

Picture a burger. You're probably thinking of a patty, cheese, and some veggies between two sesame seed buns. The buns alone aren't a burger - that's just bread! And if you get rid of the buns, you just have a weird salad. All of the components together are what make it a burger.

It can be helpful to think of an essay like a burger:



When we write an essay, all of its parts must be cohesive and make logical sense as a whole. They should work together to express and support the main idea - just like how two buns, a patty, cheese, and veggies come together to make a juicy and delicious burger!

And remember, if you order a burger, you don't want to bite into it and find the lettuce has been replaced with chocolate pudding. In the same way, don't surprise your readers with off-topic paragraphs. An essay about Romeo and Juliet probably shouldn't contain a paragraph about replacing a car battery... that would be like finding chocolate pudding in your burger!
