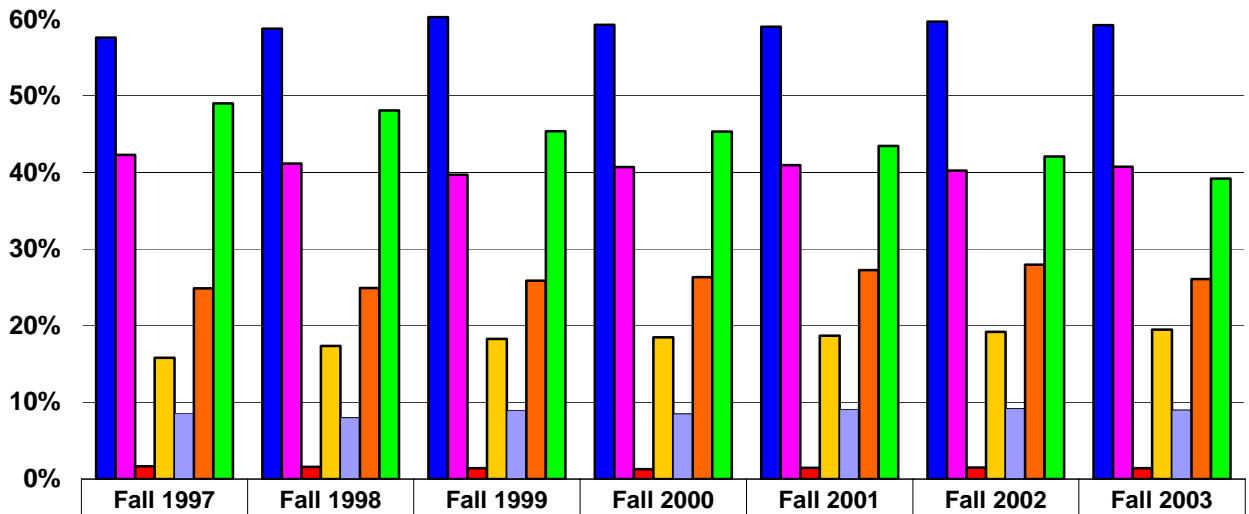


Part One – Student Access**Enrollments by Ethnicity**

Figure 4 also provides a breakdown of enrollments by ethnic categories. The data reveal that white students represent a shrinking share of the student population at the College (39 percent in 2003, down from 49 percent in 1997). Hispanic students have moved from a fifth of the student body to a quarter of the population in a seven-year period. This tracks the increasing Hispanic population of San Joaquin County in the 1990s, but still falls below the 30 percent that Hispanics represent in the community at large. There have also been steady increases in the share of Asian students attending the College. Black students attend the College in numbers that are consistent with the overall population of the county (eight percent).
