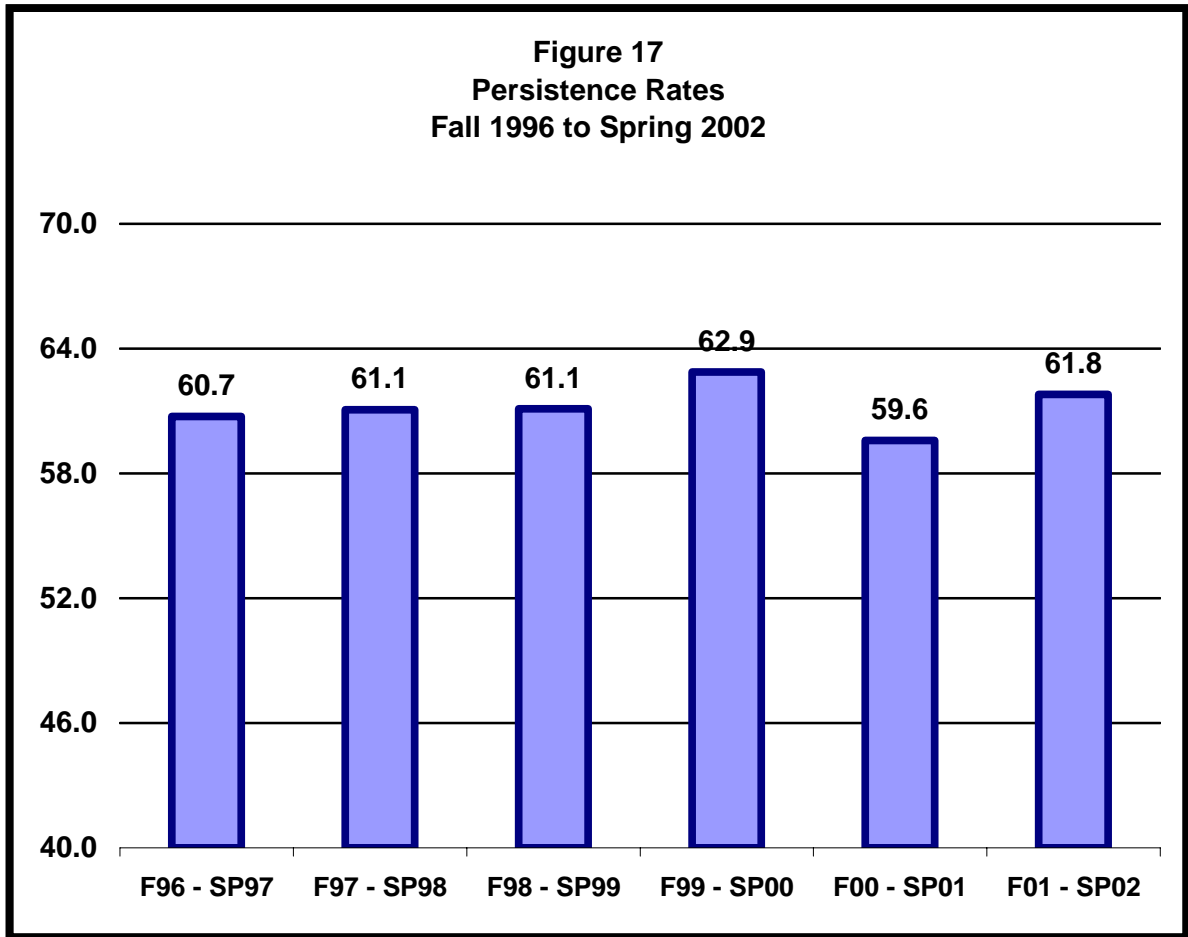


Part Two – Student Success**Persistence Rates from Term-to-Term**

Student success can also be traced by analyzing student persistence from semester to semester. A typical measure of persistence is the percentage of students who re-enroll in a subsequent semester. Fall to spring persistence rates tend to be higher than spring to fall, and the data in Figures 17 and 18 demonstrate this point. Roughly 60 percent of the College's students re-enroll in the spring after taking courses in the fall semester, whereas only 50 percent re-enroll in the fall after a spring semester. The persistence rates have remained relatively constant over the last six years.
