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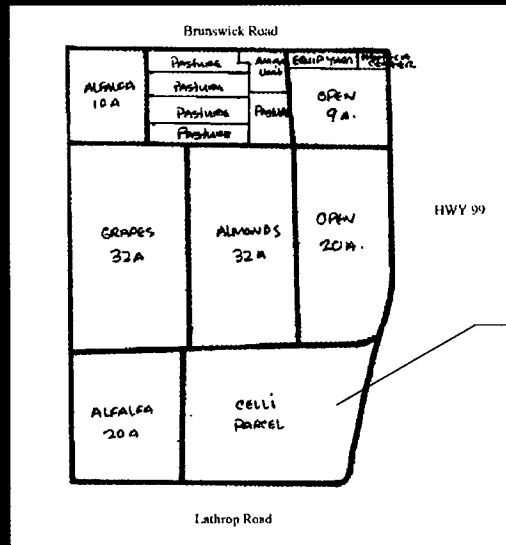

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## Steering Committee Findings

### General Education:

- Serve a growing student population as Manteca grows from 60,000 to 100,000 residents.
- Potential for growth: Business needs our students.
- Community resource



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### Steering Committee Findings

#### Heavy Equipment Maintenance:

- Existing program uses 21,985 ASF (approximately 27,161 GSF).
- Ideal Heavy Equipment program would have 42,000 GSF Lab and 15,000 GSF classroom.
- Ideal program provides for more fte, wider range of classes.
- Could share General Education space for classrooms, computer labs, support space.
- Substantial outdoor space required for operations, logistics.



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### Steering Committee Findings

#### Heavy Equipment Maintenance:

- Costs could range from \$19M for base facility to \$28M for full program build out.
- Move would free up space at Stockton campus
- Use is compatible with Manteca property
- Potential for partnerships : CAT and other heavy equipment maintenance organizations.



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## Steering Committee Findings

### Agricultural Program

- Small student population, unique resource.
- Address health and safety issues for continued operations.
- Crops/small animals.
- Some income from Almonds, etc.
- Some potential for partnerships.



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Manteca Farm North East Corner : Proposed development area



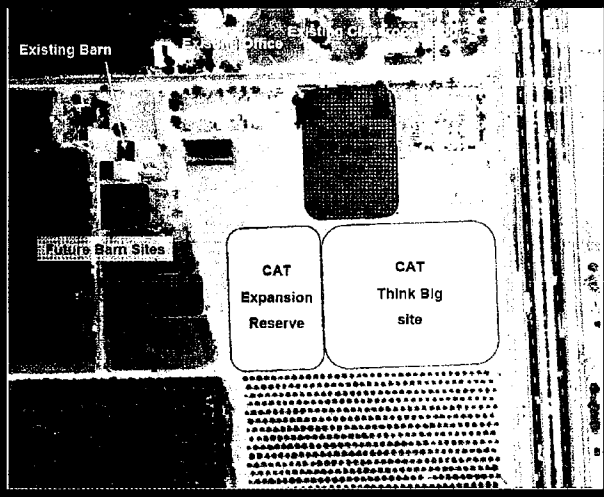
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Existing Classroom Building

- New capacity nearby

#### Electricity

- Available NE corner

#### Access

- Already in place; improvements needed

#### Boundary delineation/control

- Good fences = good neighbors



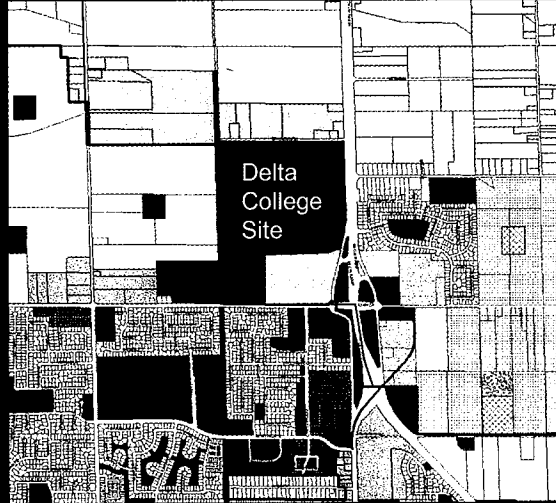

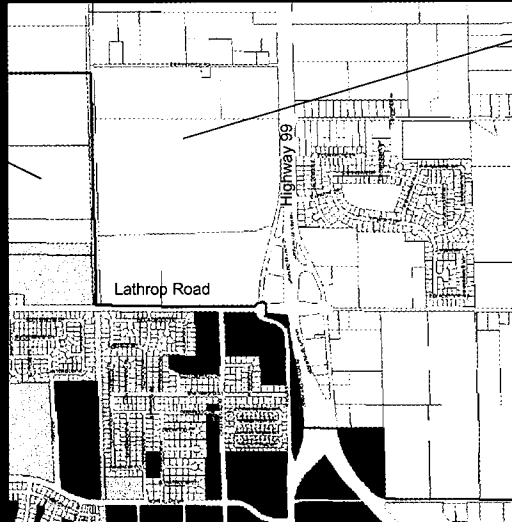
Delta College may want to consider annexation to City of Manteca so that city services become available to the campus : sewer, water, etc.

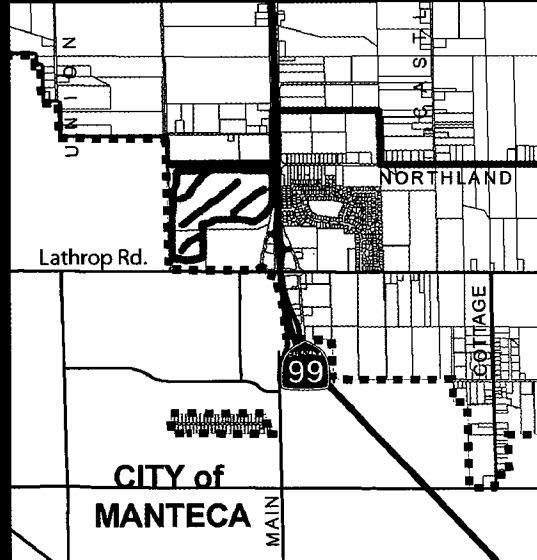

- Program level EIR: Focus on NE Corner
- Required for Master Plan and Annexation
- Preliminary evaluation
