

## **Amendment 1: Student Eligibility Requirements**

If approved, amendment #1 would allow students enrolled in five (5) or more units, with a minimum GPA of 2.0 or higher to serve on the ASBG. Additionally the ASBG constitution would be in compliance with Education Code 76061 and District Board policy.

### **What Your Vote Means**

A **YES** vote on this amendment means students would have to be enrolled in a minimum of five (5) units and have a GPA of 2.0 or higher to run for office and be elected. Additionally the ASBG would be in compliance with Education Code 76061 and District Board policy.

A **NO** vote on this amendment means students would have to be enrolled in at least nine (9) units and have a GPA of 2.5 or higher to run for office and be elected. Additionally the ASBG would not be in compliance with Education Code 76061 and District Board policy.

### **Arguments**

#### **PROS**

- The scholarship and enrollment standards for ASBG officers will be more aligned with Board Policy 4220 and Education Code 76061.
- More students will be able to run for office, resulting in an increase in student participation in the ASBG.
- Requiring students to have a GPA higher than what is stated in the Education Code and Board Policy creates a lot of confusion and controversy. Changing the policy will result in less conflict around the issue of GPA and unit requirements.
- Legally the ASBG must comply with the Education Code and District Board policy.

#### **CON**

- The ASBG will have less autonomy in setting its own scholarship and enrollment standards
- Student leaders should be held to a higher than standard, by reducing the GPA requirements and enrollment units elected leaders will no longer have above average GPAs.
- Members of the ASBG may be perceived as less competent because of their GPAs

Whereas, Education Code 76061. Elected student officers; enrollment and scholarship states the requirements a student must meet to run for office;

Whereas, The Board of Trustees recently passed BP 4220 identifying the scholarship and enrollment requirements for students serving on the ASBG; and

Whereas, Article III, Section 5. Requirements of All Officers, part A does not comply with ed. Code or Board Procedure 4220 and 5203;

Resolved, that the constitution is amended to strike out, "all officers must be enrolled and must maintain nine (9) units, six of which must be academic courses, during the fall and spring semester of their term of office and must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5" and insert "any student elected or appointed as an officer on the ASBG shall meet the scholastic requirements stated in Board Procedures 4220 and 5203. Students elected or appointed to office shall have a cumulative GPA of 2.0. The student shall be enrolled in the District at the time of election and/or appointment and throughout his/her term of office with a minimum of five semester units or the equivalent".

So if approved the section would read:

- a. **Eligibility.** Any student elected or appointed as an officer on the ASBG shall meet the scholastic requirements stated in Board Procedures 4220 and 5203.
- b. **GPA Requirements.** Students elected or appointed to office shall have a cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- c. **Enrollment Requirements.** The student shall be enrolled in the District at the time of election and/or appointment and throughout his/her term of office with a minimum of five semester units or the equivalent

## **Amendment 2**

If approved, amendment 2 will allow any student to run for any position on the Associated Student Body Government.

Amendment 2 will change the requirements listed in the ASBG constitution and remove all prerequisites and requirements that are not listed in the California Education Code or Delta College's Board Policy.

## **WHAT YOUR VOTE MEANS**

A **YES** vote on this measure means: that any student who meets the state and Delta College requirements is eligible to run for office in the ASBG.

A **NO** vote on this measure means: that not all students would be able to run for all offices in the ASBG.

## **ARGUMENTS**

### **PROS:**

- The election process will be fair and equal to all students.
- Students wishing to run for office in the ASBG will not have to meet standards made by a handful of students; which means all students can run, not just the elite.
- By following the state and Delta College requirements the ASBG will be in accordance with the law.

### **CONS:**

- Students can run for President and Vice President without having a prior years experience in the ASBG of Delta College.

#### **What Your Vote Means**

A **YES** vote for this amendment means the correct length of service for the Student Representative to the board of Trustees would be listed in the ASBG constitution.

#### **Arguments**

##### **PROS**

- The amendment does not change the current policy regarding term limits. Officers will still be limited to serving two cumulative terms, however, the information is presented in a format that is easier to read and understand.
- Requirements and expectations regarding the Student Trustee would be consistent with board policy
- There would be less confusion about when the term for the Student Trustee begins and ends

Resolved, that the constitution is amended to strike out "The Student Representative to the Board of Trustees shall serve a term in accordance with the ASBG Board Policies and Procedures, and the California Education Code" and insert "The Student Representative to the Board of Trustees shall serve a term of one year beginning May 15 to May 14 as stated in Board Procedure 1070.

So if approved the section would read:

- A. **The Student Representative to the Board of Trustees** shall serve a term of one year from May 15 to May 14 as stated in Board Procedure 1070.

Resolved, that the constitution is amended to, strike out "Individuals attaining their maximum limits of terms" and insert "Students that have served two terms"

So if approved the section would read:

- C. **Term Limits.** All elected and appointed officers can serve a maximum of two cumulative terms. Students that have served two terms shall be considered ineligible to serve on the ASBG.

Resolved, that the constitution is amended, to separate the different points of information dealing with term limits and terms into parts.

So if approved the section would read:

- A. **ASBG Officers.** All elected and appointed officers (not including the Student Representative to the Board of Trustees) shall serve a one-year term beginning June 1 and ending May 31 of the following year.
- B. **The Student Representative to the Board of Trustees** shall serve a term of one year from May 15 to May 14 as stated in Board Procedure 1070.
- C. **Term Limits.** All elected and appointed officers can serve a maximum of two cumulative terms. Students that have served two terms shall be considered ineligible to serve on the ASBG

## **Amendment 5**

### **INTERIM OFFICERS**

WHEREAS, ARTICLE V, SECTION 7 STATES THAT "THE PRESIDENT MAY ONLY APPOINT ANY WILLING ASBG OFFICER TO FULFILL DUTIES OF A VACANT OFFICE WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE ASBG."

### **RESOLVED**

That the constitution be amended, "the president may appoint any student who meets the qualifications as an interim officer"; and

That the constitution be amended, "the appointment must be approved by a two-thirds majority of the voting members."

### **WHAT YOUR VOTE MEANS**

A YES vote on this amendment means: Any qualified member of the student body, whether they are a current ASBG member or not, may be appointed as an interim officer to any vacant office with a 2/3 majority vote of the ASBG.

A NO vote on this amendment means: Only current ASBG members may be appointed to interim positions by the President of the ASBG without the consent of the ASBG board.

### **ARGUMENTS**

#### PROs

- It creates an opportunity for any qualified student to be appointed as an interim officer, rather than another board member solely
- Transparency is created when the entire ASBG board is involved in the process
- It eliminates the need for timely and costly elections
- It increases the ASBG's ability to work efficiently and effectively

#### CONs

- The president of ASBG has sole power to create a board with whomever he or she may deem the most qualified candidate
- Requiring a 2/3 vote for appointments can delay the process for appointing interim officers
- Appointing students that are not current ASBG officers and/or who are unfamiliar with the ASBG can hinder the effectiveness of the ASBG

## Amendment 6: Officer Vacancies

If approved amendment #6 would provide the ASBG with more flexibility when filling vacant positions.

### What Your Vote Means

A YES vote for this amendment means the ASBG could *choose* to appoint students to vacant positions remaining after the spring general elections rather than being required to hold a special election in the fall before filling a position through the appointment process.

A NO vote for this amendment means the ASBG would be *required* to hold a special election to fill vacant positions remaining after the spring general elections.

### Arguments

#### PROS

- The ASBG would not be obligated to hold an election in the fall, if there are vacant positions following the spring elections. By allowing the board the opportunity to fill a vacancy through the appointment process, students can be appointed over the summer and the ASBG could start the fall semester with a full board.
- Over the summer the ASBG engages in a variety of trainings and teambuilding activities, students that are elected in the fall elections often miss out on these training and bonding opportunities putting them at a disadvantage. If students can be appointed over the summer, they would not have to miss out on the various training opportunities and would be better prepared to complete their duties and assignments.
- Elections are a time consuming process. In the beginning of the semester the ASBG should be focusing on hosting events and activities that connect them with students, build community, and promote student life. If the ASBG is not required to hold fall elections, they can spend more time planning events and activities that contribute to student life.
- Depending on the number of vacant positions, the ASBG could choose whether to hold an election. The current policy requires the ASBG to hold an election, even if there is only one (1) vacant position. Considering the amount of work that goes into planning an election, it's not a productive use of the boards' time to hold an election to fill a small number of vacant positions.

#### CONS

- The students do not have the opportunity to elect students to the vacant positions. This could result in students being appointed that students may not necessarily approve of.
- The policy does not state a minimum number of vacant positions necessary to hold an election. Without a minimum number the ASBG may choose to appoint a significant number of students to fill vacant positions.
- May reduce the number of applicants for a position. The election process allows a larger number of students to apply for positions, not just students that know about the ASBG or students that members of the ASBG want to appoint. By not holding elections fewer students may be aware of the vacancies, resulting in a limited number of students applying to be appointed.
