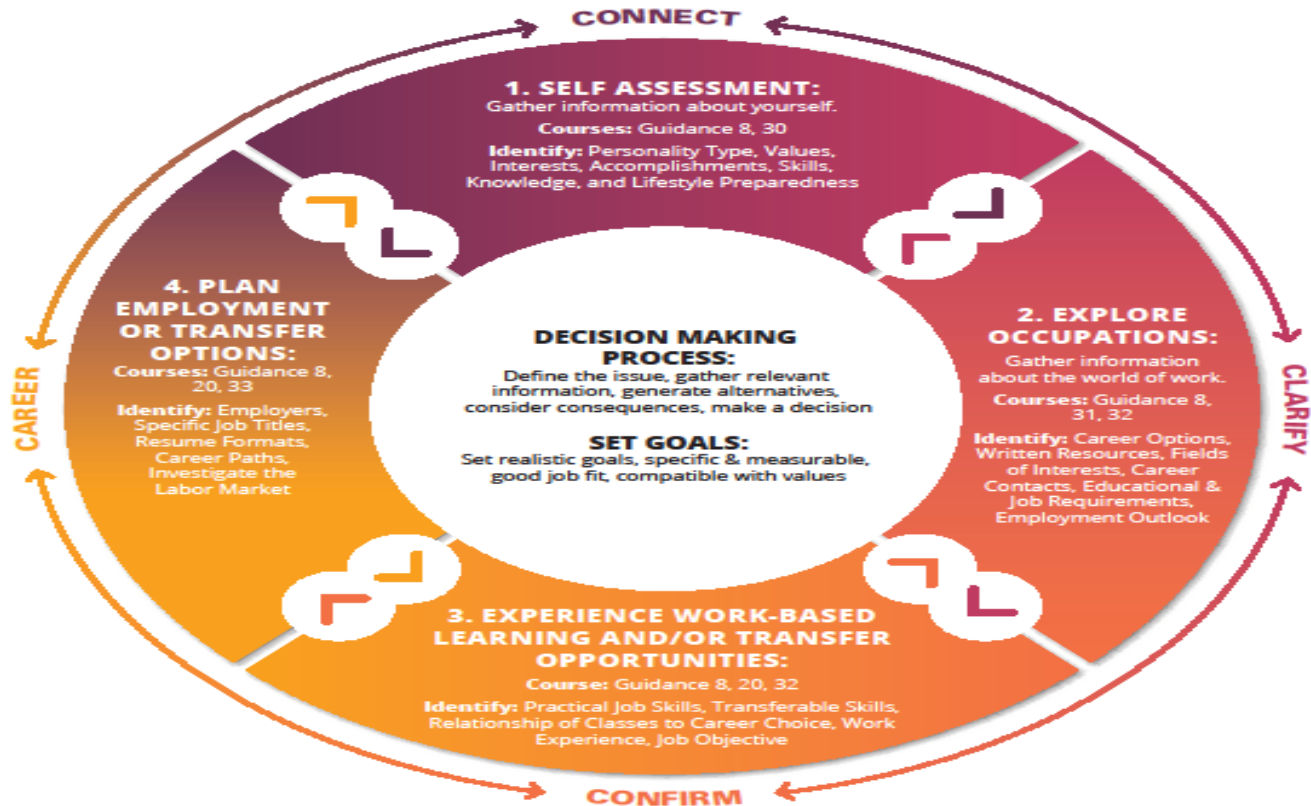
Career Life Planning is...

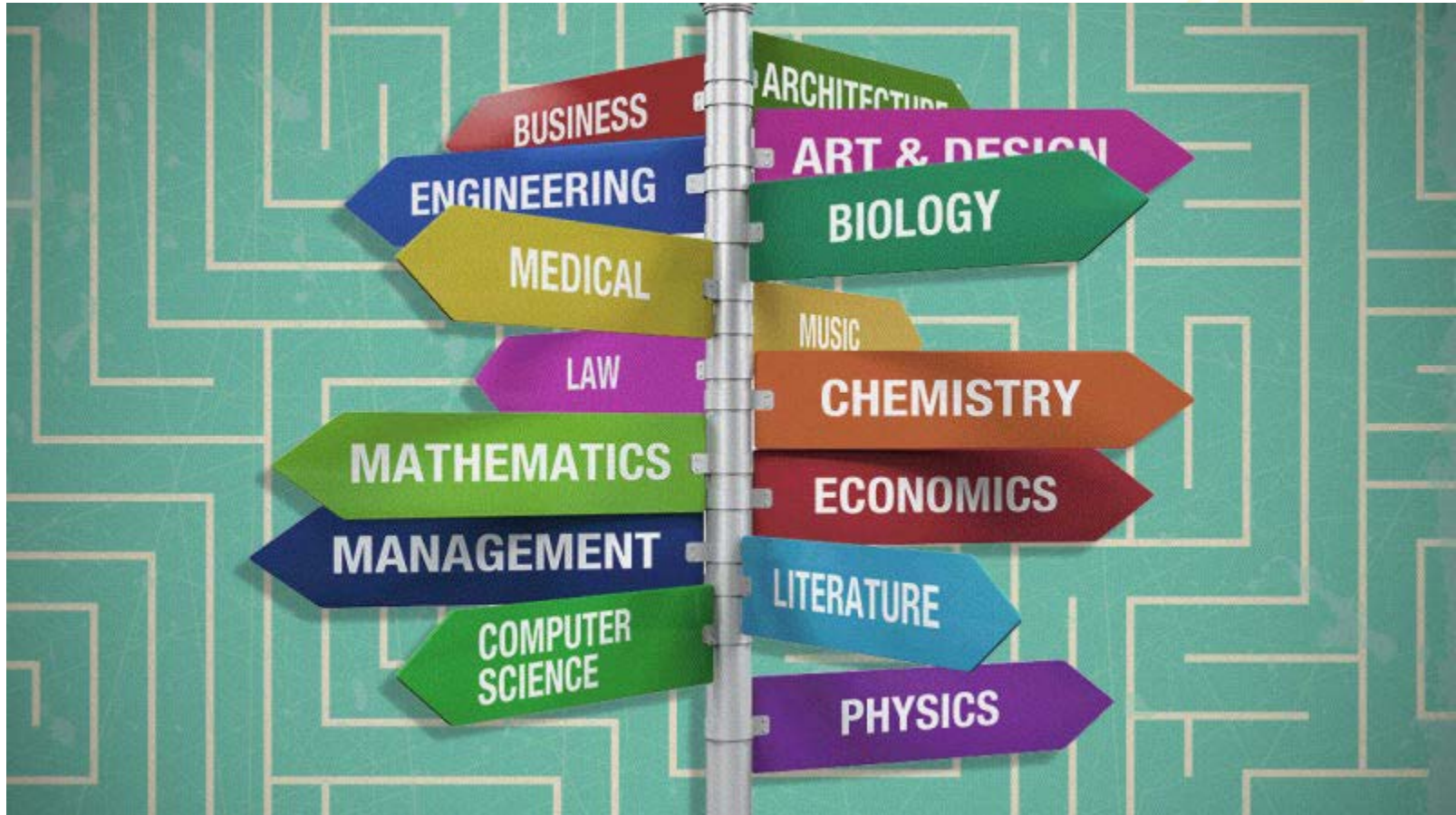

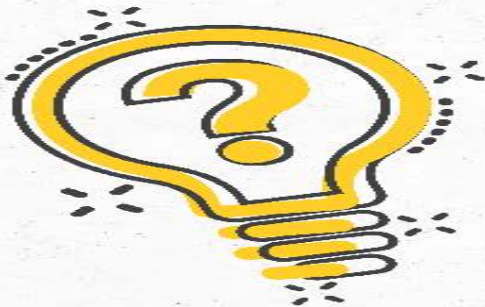

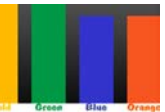
Career Assessments and Personality Inventories



MYERS-BRIGGS TYPE INDICATOR: The Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI®) is the most widely used instrument in business and education that measures personality dispositions and preferences. This instrument helps a person understand their interactions with others and heightens self-awareness as it relates to career decision making.



STRONG INTEREST INVENTORY: The Strong Interest Inventory (SII) is an assessment of your interests. Your scores can help you identify general areas of interest as well as specific activities and occupations that you might want to further explore. The Strong measures your interests, not your abilities, aptitude or values. It tells you about your pattern of interests and how your interest compares with those of people from a wide variety of occupations. Keep in mind that choosing an occupation is not a single decision, but a series of decisions. Your results on the Strong Interest Inventory can help you identify options that may lead you to a satisfying career.



TRUE COLORS: True Colors is a way of looking at your personality and how it may relate to possible careers. Careers and occupations are created by people and have personality characteristics like we do. True Colors helps you see these relationships. True Colors **IS NOT A TEST!** It gives you the opportunity to look at your personality from your own perspective.



CARD SORTS: The Knowdell™ Career Values Card Sort is a simple tool that allows your clients to prioritize their values in as little as five minutes. Fifty-four variables of work satisfaction—such as time freedom, precision work, power, technical competence and public contact—are listed and described. This is an effective tool for job seekers, those fine-tuning their present jobs and career changers at all ages and stages.



SELF-DIRECTED SEARCH: The SDS is based on a theory developed by John Holland, known as RIASEC theory, that both people and work environments can be classified according to six basic types: Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising, and Conventional. These personality types are known together as RIASEC. The assessment asks questions about an individual's aspirations, activities, competencies, interests, and other self-estimates. It takes only about 20 minutes to complete.



Online Resources



CALIFORNIA CAREERZONE: is a successful career exploration and planning system designed especially for students. Users are encouraged to work through the Interest Profiler, Work Important Profiler, and Assess Yourself assessment based on the Holland Codes for self-exploration. Comprehensive information on 900 occupations includes state specific wages, worker attributes, job characteristics, and much more. There are 300 career videos that give users a snap shot of the featured occupation.

EUREKA: is the only computerized California base career information system. For the 419 plus 700 related occupations, there is a description including job duties, pay employment outlook, preparation needed, and a list of the industries, which employ people in an occupation. Educational information includes: a description of degree programs and a list of schools offering the program plus degree titles. The Financial Aid Guide contains a scholarship search database, college costs, financial aid, grants, loans, and special aide programs. The Job Search Guide covers preparing a resume, completing job applications, preparing for job interview. Letters of introduction and networking.

O*NET: is a comprehensive database of work attributes and job characteristics. As the replacement for the Dictionary of Occupational Titles (DOT), O*NET will be the nation's primary source of occupational information. The database contains information about knowledge, skills, abilities (KSAs), interests, general work activities (GWAs), and work context. O*NET data and structure will also link related occupational, educational, and labor market information databases to the system.
