### What Is Plagiarism?



Plagiarism is using another person's words or ideas without giving credit to the other person.

-- Robert A. Harris

### **Common Types of Plagiarism**

### Tagging the 10 Types of Plagiarism



#### 1. Clone

Submitting another's work, word-for-word, as



### Hvbrid

Combines perfectly cited sources with copied passages without citation



#### 2. CTRL-C

Contains significant portions of text from a single source without alterations



#### 7. Mashup

Mixes copied material from multiple sources



#### 3. Find - Replace

Changing key words and phrases but retaining the essential content of the source



#### 8. 404 Error

Includes citations to non-existent or inaccurate information about sources



#### 4. Remix

Paraphrases from multiple sources, made to fit



### 9. Aggregator

Includes proper citation to sources but the paper contains almost no original work



#### Recycle

Borrows generously from the writer's previous work without citation



#### Re-tweet

Includes proper citation, but relies too closely on the text's original wording and/or structure

### **Desperate Types of Plagiarism**

- Copy an entire article from the Web or a subscription online database
- Download a free research paper from the Web
- Buying a paper from a commercial paper mill
- Faking a citation to get by so as to meet the deadline
- Use a paper with permission from a friend who took the same course or chose the same research topic

- 8. Some students do not believe professors actually read research papers





### Tips on Avoiding Plagiarism

- Start your research as soon as possible.
- Purchase a USB and create folders for each semester and subfolders for each class. Click on the specific class and create subfolders for each project or research paper.
- In gathering information from the online databases for your research paper, be sure to save the full-text articles or e-books as well as the out-of-the-box citations in a required style in the specific folder for the research paper.
- Know the styles of writing so that you can properly tweak and cite the sources in both the body of your article and in your Works Cited or References or Bibliography.
- List your cited sources under Works Cited or References as you write your paper so that you won't miss any citations.
