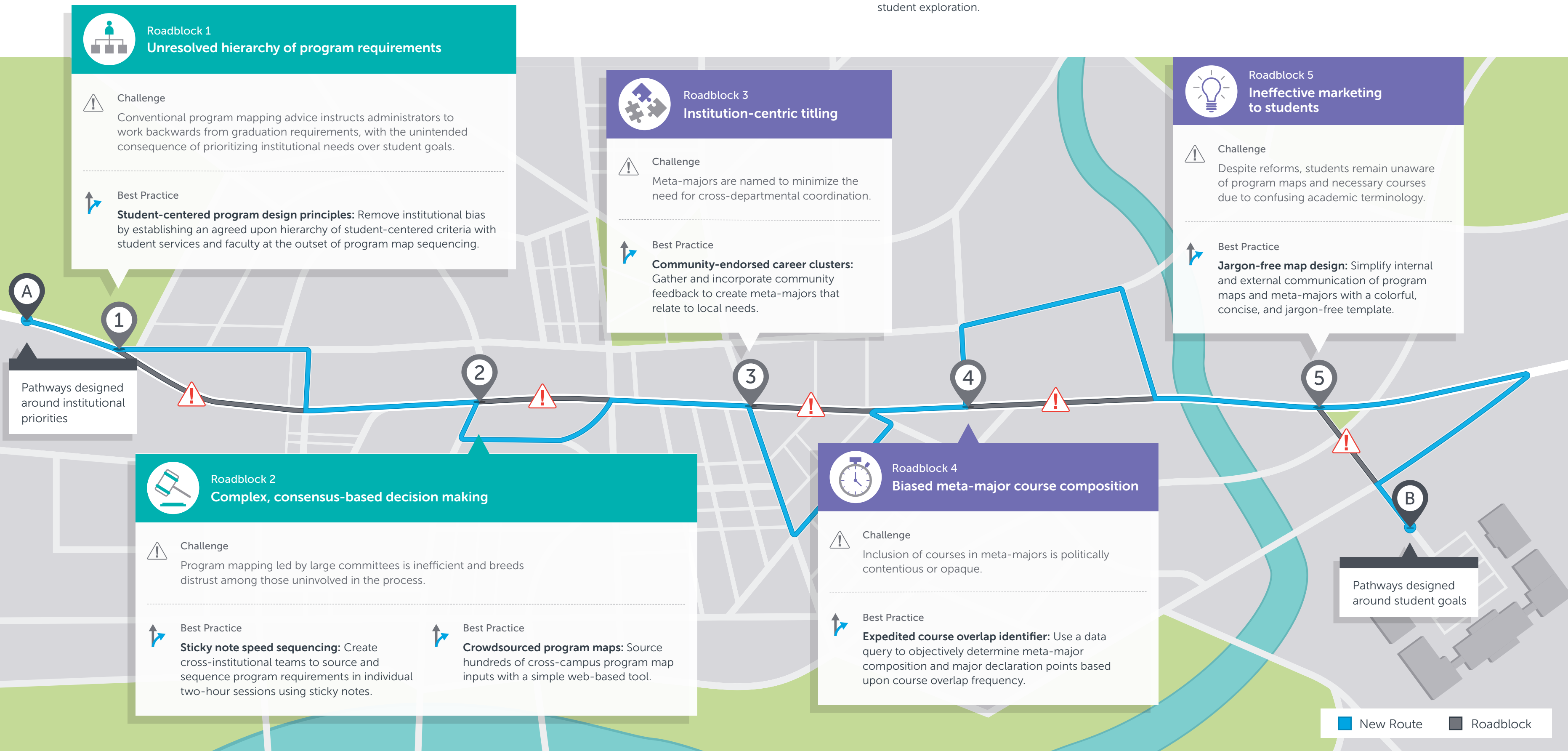


Overcome the Roadblocks on Your Route to Student-Centric Pathways
