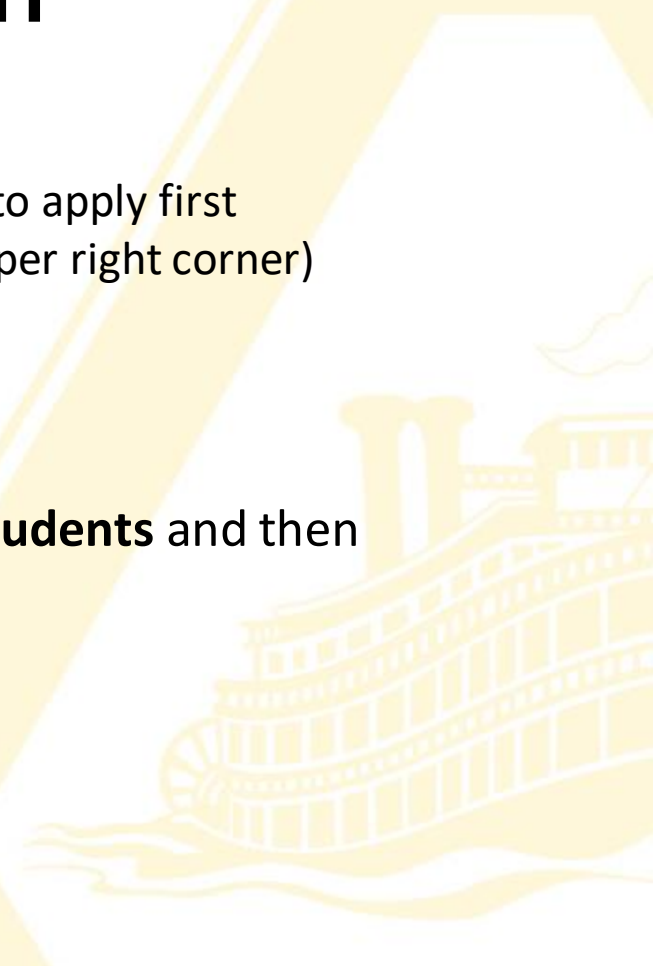

Getting Help

- When you choose your major, you'll be put into a Transfer and Career Pathway, also called a TrAC. There are **Success Coaches** in each TrAC who are there to help you.
- To find your Success Coach, go to **Academics** and click **Transfer and Career Pathways**. Then, scroll down and click your TrAC.

An online learning community for students who learn differently, TASK offers an intensive orientation to Delta College. Students meet Monday – Thursday, June 7–17, from 8:30 am to 11:45 am. Find the application at www.deltacollege.edu/TASK. Open until filled. Limited to 30 students.

- **Assists students in their transition from high school to college with:**
 - ❖ Accessing DSPS services
 - ❖ Understanding an Academic Accommodations Plan (APP) and self-advocacy
 - ❖ Exploring Delta College support services and academic resources
 - ❖ Learning and study strategies

- **Students enroll in two classes:**
 - ❖ Learning Skills 072: Transition for Academic Success (1 unit)
 - ❖ Counseling 11: Introduction to College (.5 unit)

Transition to *College*

Differences between high school and college...

K-12

- District identifies students
- Established eligibility
- Develop IEP/ITP
- Provides support and/or special classes
- Ensures IEP is implemented & goals met
- Parents & Special Ed professionals advocate for student
- Fundamental alteration is allowed in program of study & instructional methods
- Student may receive Certificate of Completion instead of diploma
- Personal attendant services may be provided
- Transportation to and from school

College

- Student self-identifies; requests services
- Student submits disability verification outlining functional/educational limitations
- Provides academic accommodations & limited Educational Assistance courses
- Student is responsible for own goals & progress
- Student advocates for self, DSPS provides support & guidance
- Accommodations do not alter fundamental nature of credit courses, degree or certificate requirements
- Student may receive approved vocational certificate or AA/AS degree
- Student provides attendant care
- Public transportation, Dial-A-Ride/C.A.T./SMART
