

PROGRAM/CLASS	ABBREVIATED DESCRIPTION	INFORMATION
SPANISH A.A.T	The Associate in Arts in Spanish for Transfer degree provides a sequential course of studies that will give students a greater understanding of the Spanish language and Spanish cultures/area studies. This program is designed as a seamless pathway for students planning to transfer to a California State University (CSU) with a major in Spanish, and for students who are interesting in acquiring linguistic and cultural competency in Spanish. MEXICAN AMERICAN HISTORY	HIST 31 This course is designed as a lecture course on the rich historical development of the Mexican American people from their pre-contact Indigenous roots through the Chicana and Chicano movements of the 1960s, 1970s and beyond. (HBCU, UC, CSU)	LEARN MORE
MARIACHI MUSIC ENSEMBLE	Music 56 This course is a mixed ensemble of instruments and voices for the study and performance of Mariachi repertoire. The ensemble is open by audition. This course is repeatable.	LEARN MORE

INTRODUCTION TO LATINA/LATINO LITERATURE	ENG 62E This course introduces students to Latin America literature from Colonial Period to present: indigenous legends, chronicles, epistles, poetry, novel, drama, and short story. Critical reading of Latino/a literature and its relationship to social issues and identity politics of Latinos/as will be discussed. Literary movements will be studied, for example, the Boom, the New Latin American Cinema, and magical realism. Major authors may include but not limited to Nobel Prize winners Pablo Neruda, Gabriel Garcia Marquez, Rigoberta Menchu, and Octavio Paz. (HBCU, UC, CSU)	LEARN MORE
CHICANA/O LATINA/O STUDIES THROUGH LITERATURE	SPAN 20 This course examines Chicanx and Latinx culture, as related to its history and experience in U.S. society, through analysis of the historical development and current trends in Chicana/o and Latina/o literature. (HBCU, UC, CSU)	LEARN MORE
ETHNIC STUDIES: CHICANA/O STUDIES	ETHNS 34 This inter-disciplinary course explores the racial, ethnic, cultural, economic, social, and political issues that impact Chicana/Chicano people in the United States from both historic and contemporary perspectives. The course interrogates the intersections of race, ethnicity, nationality, gender, sexuality, class, ability, and mental health as they relate to Chicana/o experiences in the United States. 

Tips:

Keep in mind that most scholarships require letters of recommendation from faculty. This means it's a good idea to work hard so that your professors will be able to write you a solid letter. Request your letters at the end of the fall semester so they will be ready for the March deadline. Be sure to email your request and give your professor at least one month to write it. In the email body remind them what class you took with them, what grade you earned, tell them what scholarship(s) you are applying for, and what the deadline is.

Meet with a scholarship specialist to make sure you understand all the requirements and meet the deadlines.
