WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP?

- Graduating High School Seniors
- Community College Transfer Students
- Undergraduate Students
- Graduate Students

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be of Hispanic Heritage
- Minimum of 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) for High School Students
- Minimum of 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) for College and Graduate Students
- Plan to enroll Full-Time in an accredited, not-for-profit, 4-year university, or graduate school, during the FALL of a scholarship cycle (year)
- U.S. Citizen, Permanent Legal Resident, DACA or Eligible Non-Citizen (as defined by FAFSA)
- Complete FAFSA or state based financial aid application (if applicable)

Other:

- All majors and graduate fields accepted
- Emphasis on STEM majors

THE GATES MILLENNIUM SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility Criteria:

- ✓ African American, American Indian-Alaska Native, Asian & Pacific Islander American, or Hispanic American
- ✓ U.S. Citizen, Permanent Resident, or Foreign National
- ✓ High school senior, GED recipient, or high school graduate entering an accredited college for the first time, as a full-time, degree-seeking, first-year student
- ✓ Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3
- ✓ Must apply for federal financial aid using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Award Amount: \$1,000 - \$5,000

Deadline: August 1st - January 13th at 11:59PM EST

Eligibility Criteria:

- ✓ Must be of Hispanic Heritage
- ✓ Minimum of 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) for High School Students
- ✓ Minimum of 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) for College and Graduate Students

- ✓ Plan to enroll Full-Time in an accredited, not-for-profit, 4-year university, or graduate school, during the FALL of a scholarship cycle (year)
- ✓ Complete FAFSA or state based financial aid application (if applicable)

¡ADELANTE! FUND MILLERCOORS ENGINEERING AND SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility Criteria:

- College junior or senior by the fall semester
- Must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident
- Must be of Hispanic descent
- Must have a 3.0 GPA or above
- Maintain full-time enrollment status (12 hours) for the duration of the scholarship period
- Provide two letters of recommendation highlighting leadership potential
- Scholar must attend ¡Adelante!'s Annual Leadership Institute in San Antonio, TX (Scholarship includes airfare, hotel accommodations, and conference registration)
- Must attend a partnering university

Eligible majors:

- Biochemistry
- Computer Science
- Electrical Engineering
- Mechanical Engineering

*All engineering majors may apply for this scholarship but preference will be given to listed engineering majors above first.

ACTUARIAL DIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP**Eligibility Criteria:**

- Each applicant must fulfill all the requirements listed below:
- Intent on pursuing a career in the actuarial profession
- Must have at least one birth parent who is a member of one of the following minority groups: Black/African American, Hispanic, Native North American, Pacific Islander
- Will be a full-time undergraduate student at a U.S. accredited educational institution
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale), emphasis on math or actuarial courses
- Entering college freshmen must have a minimum ACT math score of 28 or SAT math score of 600

Award Amount: \$4,000 (maximum)

PA JUDITH MCMANUS PRICE SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility Criteria:

- Women and members of one of the following minority groups: African American, Hispanic American or Native American
- Citizens of the United States
- Students enrolled or officially accepted for enrollment in an undergraduate or graduate planning program accredited by the PAB (Planning Accreditation Board)
- Students who intend to work as practicing planners in the public sector (which includes local, state & federal government, and not-for-profit careers)
- Students able to document their need for financial assistance
- Prior winners of any APA-administered fellowship or scholarship program are not eligible.

Award Amount: \$4,000 (maximum)

CANFIT NUTRITION, PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND CULINARY ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility Criteria:

- All applicants must be ethnic students, affiliated from African-American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Asian-American, Pacific Islander or Latino/Hispanic descent.
- Must be an Undergraduate. Enrollment in an approved bachelor level program in Nutrition or Physical Education at an accredited (WASC) university in California
- 50 semester units (or equivalent) of college credits completed with an official copy of college transcript and a 2.5 or better GPA (cumulative)
- Enrollment in a culinary arts college in California
- Prior completed units (or equivalent) of college credits not necessary to apply

ESA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Eligibility Criteria:

- Women or minority students
- Pursuing degrees leading to careers in computer and video game arts (high school seniors must already be accepted into a program)
- Enrolling or enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States

- Maintaining a grade point average of 2.75 or above on a 4.0 scale
- U.S. citizens

FRANK KAZMIERCZAK MEMORIAL MIGRANT SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility Criteria:

- Child of a migrant worker or a migrant worker (priority will be given to those with mobility in the last 3 years)
- Teaching as a career goal
- Scholastic achievement
- Financial need
- A completed application form must be submitted annually by February 1st, accompanied by at least two (2) letters of recommendation and an official school transcript
- In addition, the applicant must include a personal essay of 300 to 500 words telling about his/her reason for wanting to become a teacher.

HENAAC SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Eligibility Criteria:

- Applicants must demonstrate merit through academic achievements, leadership and campus/community activities
- Applicants must be pursuing a science, technology, engineering or math degree
- Applicants must have an overall grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Applicants must be of Hispanic origin and/or must significantly demonstrate leadership or service within the Hispanic community
- Recipients must be enrolled in an accredited undergraduate or graduate program for the preceding fall semester, at an accredited 2-yr or 4-yr college/university in the U.S. or its territories

Award Amount: \$10,000 (maximum)

LEONARD M. PERRYMAN COMMUNICATIONS SCHOLARSHIP FOR RACIAL ETHNIC MINORITY STUDENTS

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must be a United Methodist ethnic minority
- A current college junior or senior
- Enrolled in a journalism/communications program at an accredited college/university
